Hang your bird feeder where you are convinced that it is in the optimum place.

• Finding the right spot. Birds like to feel safe. So the feeder should be hung in an area where the birds have a clear view over the entire feeding area. They also like to be in the sun if possible, but not in the wind. So if there is a little fence shelter they would like that. As long as it is not too close so cats become a danger.

• Hang it away from trees, bushes, fences, and building. This will help keep squirrels and predators from causing problems for the birds.

• If you are hanging on a tree, you can get a squirrel baffle to prevent the squirrel from climbing down and getting the food.

Or you could even use a free standing pole.

There may not be any 100% perfect spot. But a little experimentation should get the birds fed and transform your yard into a vibrant sanctuary for our little friends.
